Our Seed Library is a collection of packaged seeds that are free to take home and plant in your garden. It is unnecessary to return the seeds to the library, although we welcome donations of seeds harvested or locally sourced to help maintain our supply. You can find the Seed Library on the counter behind the Information Desk.

FAQ's

- How much does it cost?
 The seeds are entirely free.
- Do I need a library card to use the Seed Library?
 No (although a library card offers many other benefits and is easy to get!).
- 3. What types of seeds are available?
 We offer a variety of vegetables, fruits, herbs, and flowers. Check our supply often since it may change.
- 4. How many seed packets may I have?
 Each individual may have up to five packets of seeds (one variety each) per visit.
- 5. How will I know how to get my seeds to grow successfully? Growing times and conditions will vary depending on the seed variety. Each variety is listed on our website and linked to instructions that will assist you.
- 6. I have heard of One Seed, One State. Is this the same thing? No, but it is very similar. The Howell Carnegie Library participates in One Seed, One State, and you may obtain your 2024 seed variety, Mammoth Long Island Dill, from the Information Desk.
