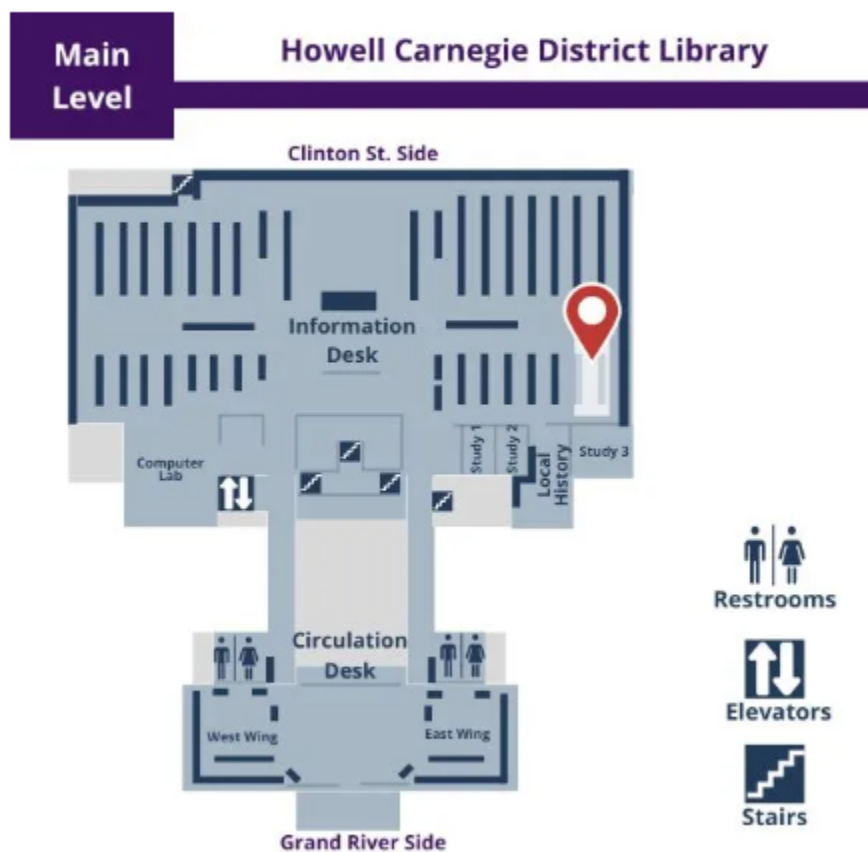


A Genre is a category of book. The following is a brief description and location of the fiction genres we use to sort our collection.

Fantasy: Fiction that contains magic, monsters, other-worldly, and supernatural elements.

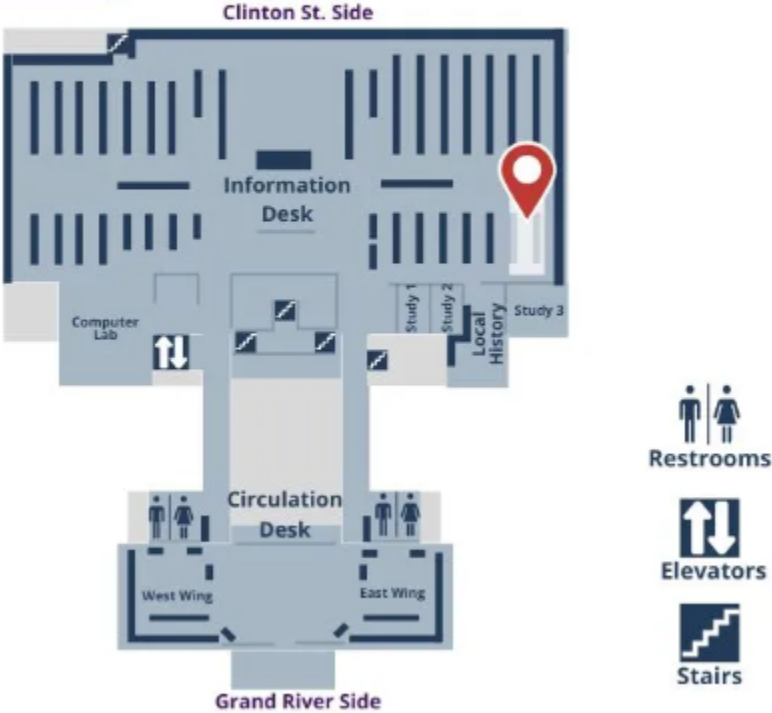
Main Level - Fantasy

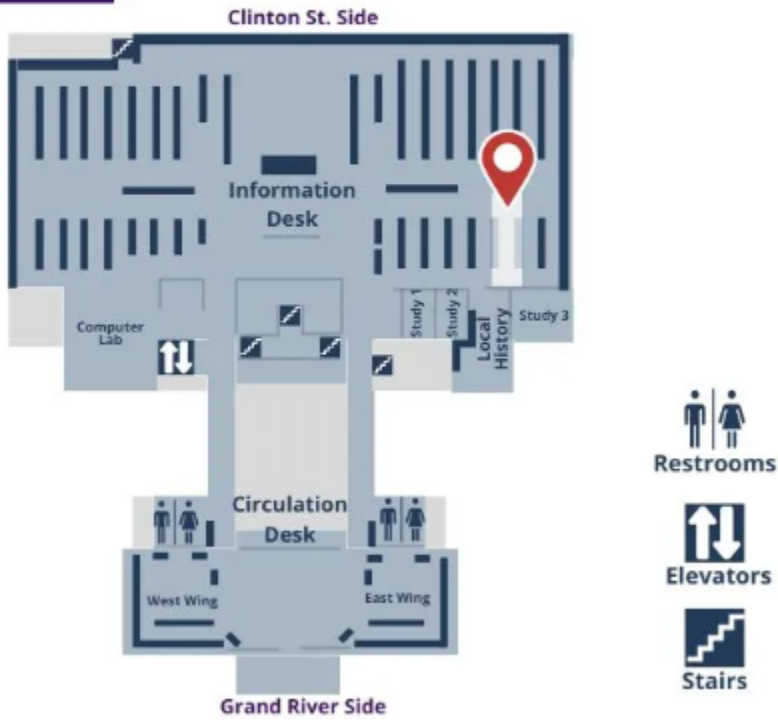


Inspirational: Fiction written to uplift and inspire readers. May contain faith-based content, religion, or spirituality.

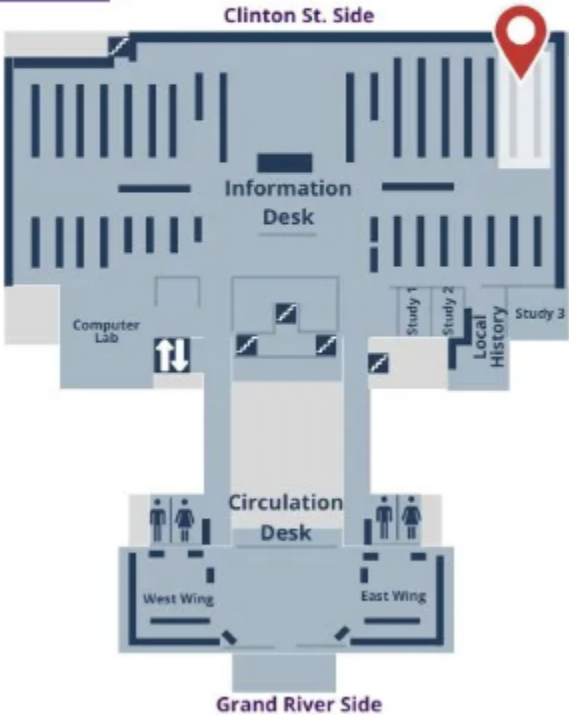

Main Level - Mystery

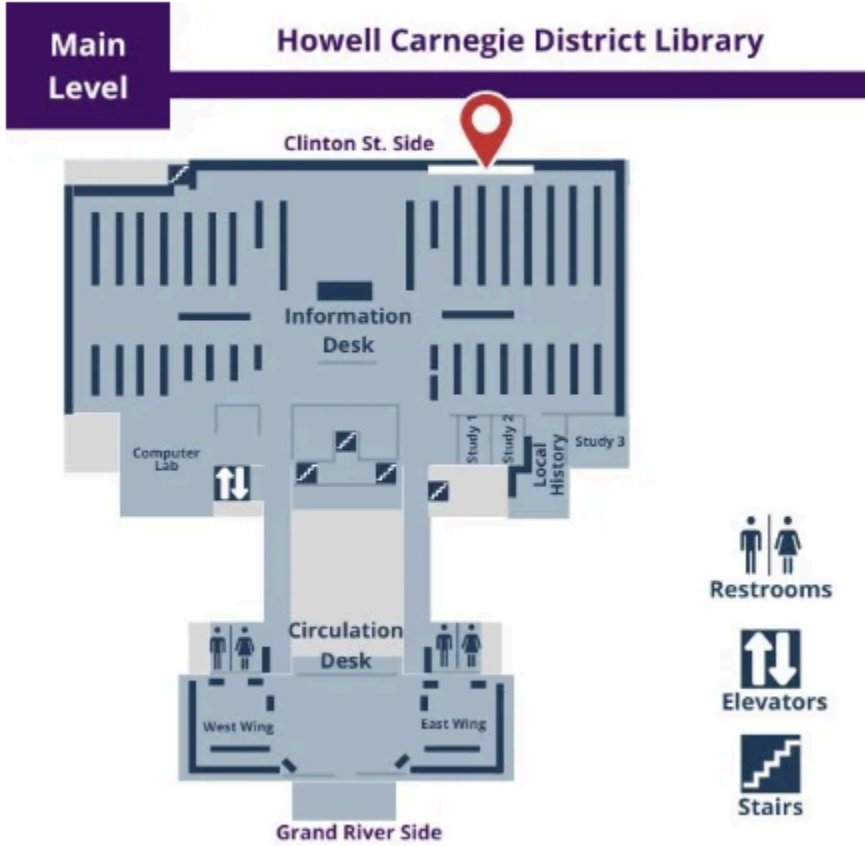

Romance: Fiction focused on the attraction and relationship of at least two characters. Romance books will typically have a happy ending.

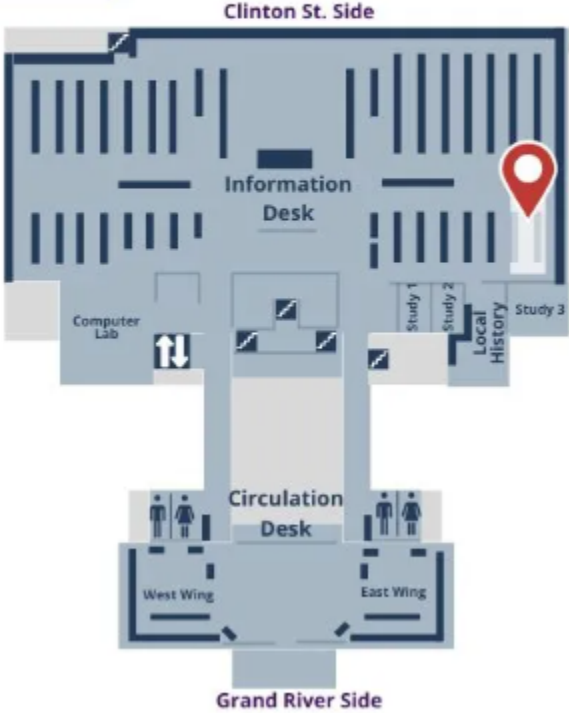
Main Level - Romance
